Ākonga explore the curriculum through an integrated approach, along with a focus of equity. Over their two years here, our ākonga will learn from the context of Understand, Know and Do. Ākonga explore learning from a Mana Whenua perspective and have access to te ao me tikanga Māori.

Our MIS curriculum ensures that all ākonga in our kura learn how our ANZH (Aotearoa NZ's Histories) have shaped our present day lives. Furthermore, our MIS curriculum is also dynamic, diverse and innovative; including a whole-school approach to Te Reo Māori, local historical narratives and hands-on support from local iwi.

Ākonga are 'hooked' into projects planned by kaiako; encompassing the essential learning areas of Science, Social Sciences, Health, Technology and the Arts. Project-based learning enables ākonga to become responsible, self-directed, and life-long learners. We strive for ākonga to become critical thinkers and effective problem solvers.

#### E-Learning - preparing for the 21st Century

We are a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) kura, and E-Learning is an integral part in our learning. Our Digital Curriculum provides authentic learning experiences, and supports higher-order and collaborative learning.



#### Te Reo Māori

Maidstone Intermediate recognises that Te Reo Māori is an official language of New Zealand. Te Reo Māori, tikanga and kawa are embedded in our learning programme.

#### Korean

Languages

Connections with the Korean Education Centre enables us to be the only Intermediate in Wellington to have a Korean kaiako teaching us the Korean language and culture.

### Mandarin

Our kura offers a Chinese Mandarin language and culture programme through the Confucius Institute of Victoria University.

#### Other languages

Through interactive online programmes our ākonga can learn many other languages.





### Te Awa Kairangi - Kaupapa Mātanga Technology & Arts

Our Kaupapa Mātanga Programme consists of five areas STEAM that allows akong a the opportunity to experience higher levels of learning.

#### Visual Arts

Akonga have the opportunity to generate their ideas in a variety of artistic forms, both traditional and digital.

#### **Performing Arts**

Designed to give akonga the opportunity to practically explore the beginning skills of music, dance, drama, and film with their peers.

#### **Materials Technology**

Ākonga can explore a wide range of resistant materials. They will learn about the properties of these materials and their suitability for use.

### **Arts Enrichment**

Our aim is to provide creative and cultural experiences for akonga to engage in across the year including:

#### **Music Tuition**

Itinerant music teachers come in weekly allowing us to offer music tuition throughout the year. Ākonga can sign up for small group lessons in: Keyboard, Drums, Acoustic Guitar, Bass Guitar, Ukulele, and Singing.

#### **School Bands**

We have two bands that perform at assemblies, Battle of the Bands, and other events.

#### **Showcase / School Production**

To celebrate all the mahi our ākonga do in The Arts throughout the year we put on a Showcase which combines the different groups into one big performance.

#### Showquest


A massive competition where we pull together dancers, gymnasts, actors, film makers, and backstage crew to put together a mini Broadway Production to participate in the Samoa, Cook Islands, Tokelau, Māori and more. national event that is Showquest.

STEAM is an approach to learning that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics as access points for guiding student inquiry. Students have the opportunity to experiment and test with robotics, electronics, game design and other digital technologies.

#### **Food Technology**

Focuses on introducing akonga to the 'technology process'. This will assist them in designing, making and modifying food products to meet the requirements of a

#### **Dance Troupe and Acting Troupe**

Dance Troupe explores a range of dance styles with the intention of putting on performances both in and out of school. Acting Troupe ākonga can join to refine their acting skills, and learn more about improvisation, stage, and screen acting.

#### Kapa Haka

This is an opportunity for akonga to extend their capability in waiata, haka, and tikanga Māori. They also explore different elements and learn the history of traditional weaponry such as mau, rakau, patu, poi, and tīti tōrea in a modern context. Kapa Haka performs at different festivals, challenges and competitions.

### **SPORT**

### **Education Outside The Classroom**

- ◆ EOTC provides ākonga access to hands-on experiences that are not available inside the classroom.
- ♦ Ākonga learn vital skills such as team building and leadership.

- ◆ Rōpū excursions to take learning outside the classroom.



### **Learning Support**

- ♦ MIS has a Special Needs Coordinator (SENCO), and a Learning Support Coordinator (LSC). Their main task is to work collaboratively alongside the ākonga, kaimahi, and whānau to ensure ākonga have access to as many opportunities as possible.
- We have a purpose-built Learning Centre.
- We provide high quality holistic support for ākonga who have special educational, emotional, behavioural, or physical needs.
- We foster a school-wide acceptance and positive attitude towards ākonga with special needs.
- Learning Support also includes: Resource Teacher of Learning Behaviour (RTLB), reading programmes, and Steps Web

We believe that emerging adolescents are very capable of taking an active leadership role in our kura.


Our leadership programmes enable us to foster and grow leadership, and provide ākonga with opportunities for development in their areas of responsibility or interest.
